# Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 111,000 Jobs Year Over Year in August 2022 Arizona Unemployment increased to 3.5%


The Arizona seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased from 3.3% in July 2022 to 3.5% in August 2022. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased from 3.5% in July 2022 to 3.7% in August 2022. Month over month, Arizona's seasonally adjusted labor force increased by 11,137 individuals or 0.3%. Year over year, the labor force increased by 67,166 individuals or 1.9%. Month over month, Arizona total nonfarm employment increased by 46,300 jobs or 1.5%. Year over year, total nonfarm employment increased by 111,000 jobs or 3.7%.

### **Month Over Month**

Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 46,300 jobs or 1.5% in August. Prior to the pandemic, nonfarm employment averaged a gain of 54,000 jobs in August (2010-2019). The government sector¹ recorded a gain of 38,200 jobs in August, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average gain of 35,600 jobs. Gains in the government sector were largely driven by the start of a new school year for public schools. The private sector recorded a gain of 8,100 jobs in August, led by gains in Construction. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 18,300 jobs in August.

### **Year Over Year**





Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate Seasonally Adjusted




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change




### Arizona & U.S. Construction **Employment**

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Employment Services Year-to-Year Percent Change
