#### Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 98,400 Jobs Year Over Year in January 2023 Arizona Unemployment Decreased to 3.8%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.8% in January 2023 from 4.0% in December 2022. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.4% in January 2023 from 3.5% in December 2022.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 7,783 individuals, or 0.2%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 86,269 individuals, or 2.4%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 32,600 jobs<sup>1</sup>. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 98,400 jobs, or 3.2%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 22,700 individuals, or 0.7%, month over month.

#### **Month Over Month**

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 32,600 jobs in January. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 51,000 jobs on average in January. The government sector<sup>2</sup> recorded a gain of 2,700 jobs in January, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 9,100 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within State Government (5,400 jobs). The private sector recorded a loss of 35,300 jobs in January, led by losses in Trade, Transportation & Utilities (-16,500 jobs) and Professional & Business Services (-6,400 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 41,900 jobs in January.



- Financial Activities (-1,800 jobs)
- Construction (-1,200 jobs)



#### **Year Over Year**

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 98,400 jobs or 3.2% in January year over year. Private sector employment increased by 90,700 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 7,700 jobs year over year.





#### Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate




### Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

#### Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment




#### Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade

**Year-to-Year Percent Change** 




#### Arizona & U.S. Employment Services

Year-to-Year Percent Change




### Arizona & U.S. Health Care
