Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 60,700 Jobs Year Over Year in April 2023 Arizona Unemployment Decreased to 3.4%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.4% in April 2023 from 3.5% in March 2023. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.4% in April 2023 from 3.5% in March 2023.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 3,421 individuals, or 0.1%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 63,628 individuals, or 1.8%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment increased by 13,800 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 60,700 jobs, or 2.0%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 12,500 individuals, or 0.4%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 13,800 jobs in April. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment gained 9,500 jobs on average in April. The private sector recorded a gain of 10,300 jobs in April, led by gains in Leisure & Hospitality (5,100 jobs) and Private Education & Health Services (4,300 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 8,600 jobs in April. The government sector¹ recorded a gain of 3,500 jobs in April, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average gain of 900 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government (2,000 jobs).



Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 60,700 jobs or 2.0% in April year over year. Private sector employment increased by 47,000 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 13,700 jobs year over year.











Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate

Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment




Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Employment Services

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Health Care
