Arizona Employment Decreased by 5,400 Jobs Since January 2024 Arizona Unemployment Increased to 3.9%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 3.9% in January 2025 from 3.8% in December 2024. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 4.0% in January 2025 from 4.1% in December 2024.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 11,368 individuals, or 0.3%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 43,683 individuals, or 1.2%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 40,700 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment decreased by 5,400 jobs, or 0.2%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 7,400 individuals, or 0.2%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 40,700 jobs in January. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 51,000 jobs on average in January. The private sector recorded a loss of 34,900 jobs in January, led by losses in Trade, Transportation & Utilities (-18,900 jobs) and Health Care and Social Assistance (-4,400 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 41,900 jobs in January. The government sector recorded a loss of 5,800 jobs in January, less than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 9,100 jobs. Employment losses in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government (-4,400 jobs).

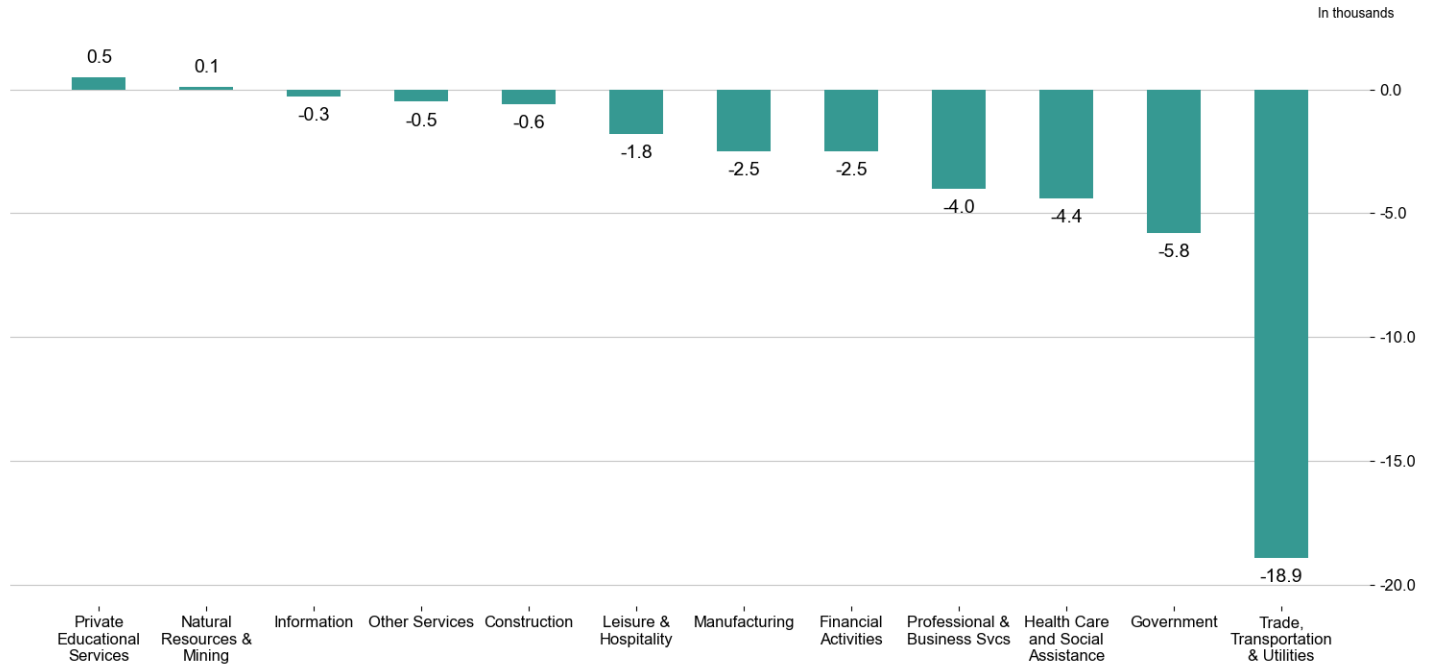

Year Over Year

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 5,400 jobs or -0.2% in January year over year. Private sector employment decreased by 2,700 jobs year over year, while government employment decreased by 2,700 jobs year over year.

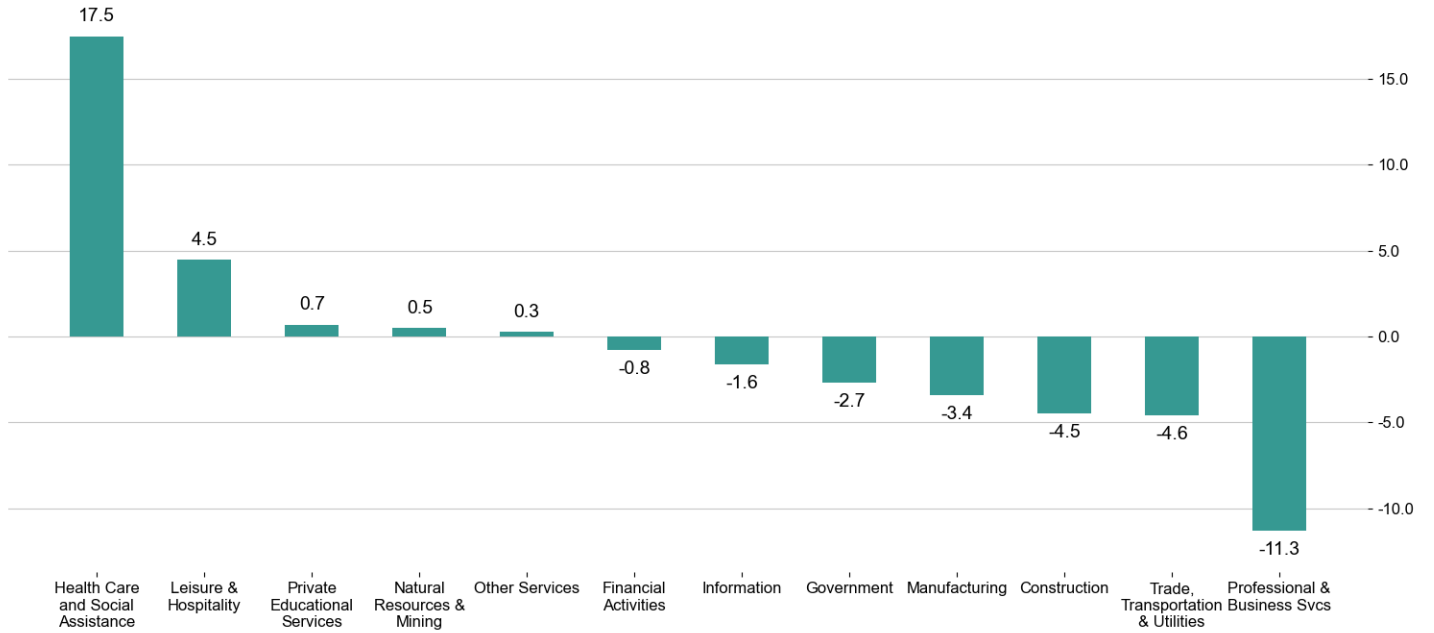

Arizona NSA Year-Over-Year Employment Gain/Loss by Sector

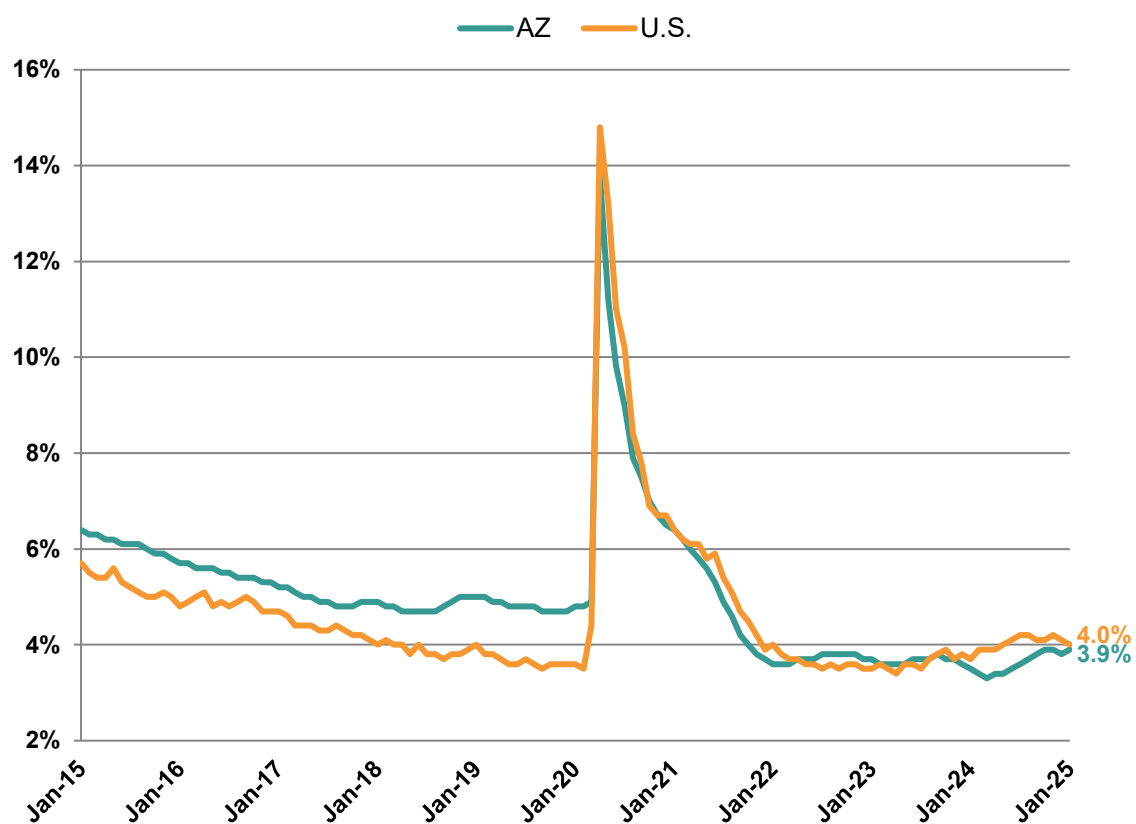

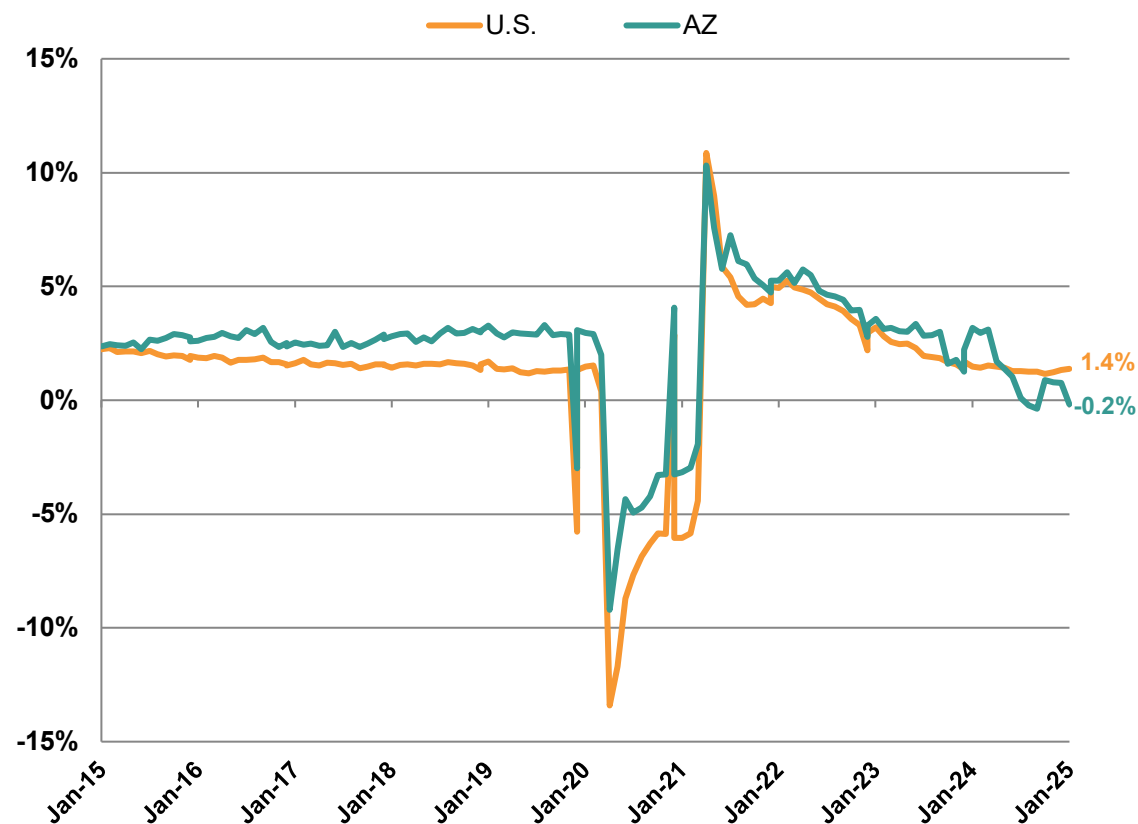

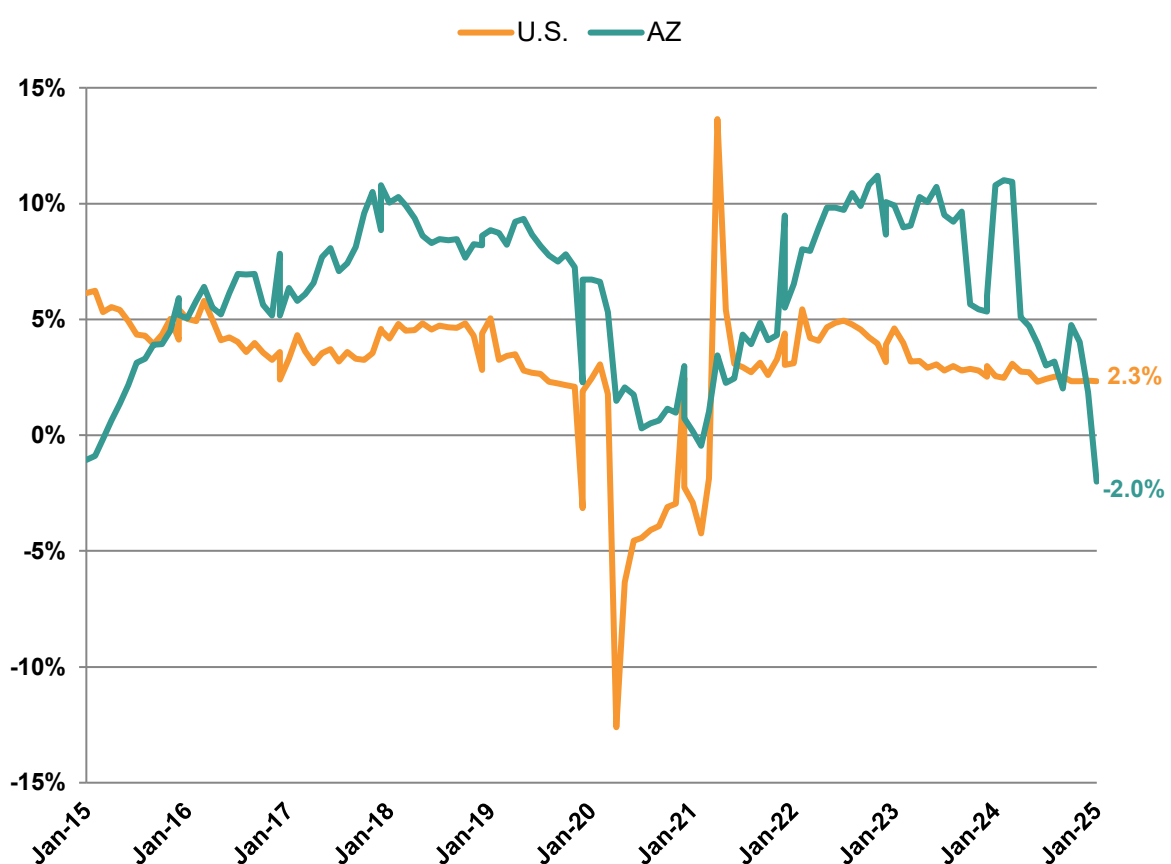
Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted



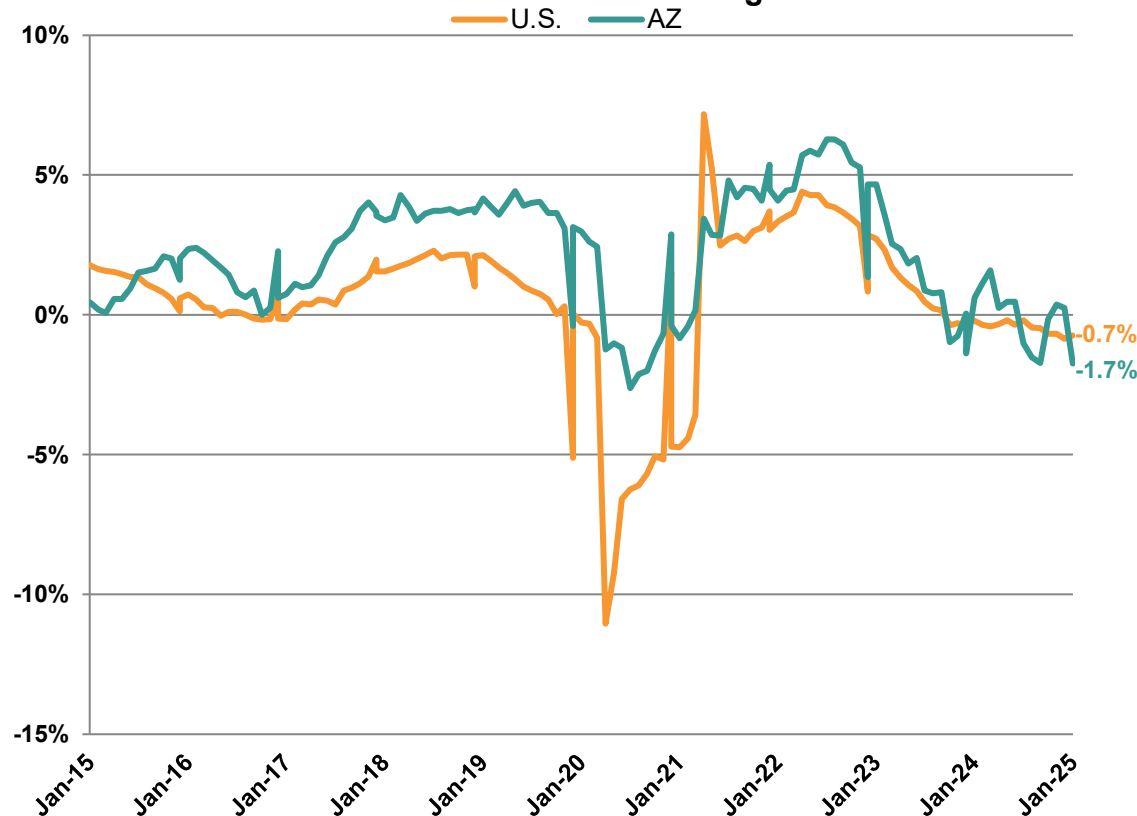
Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change



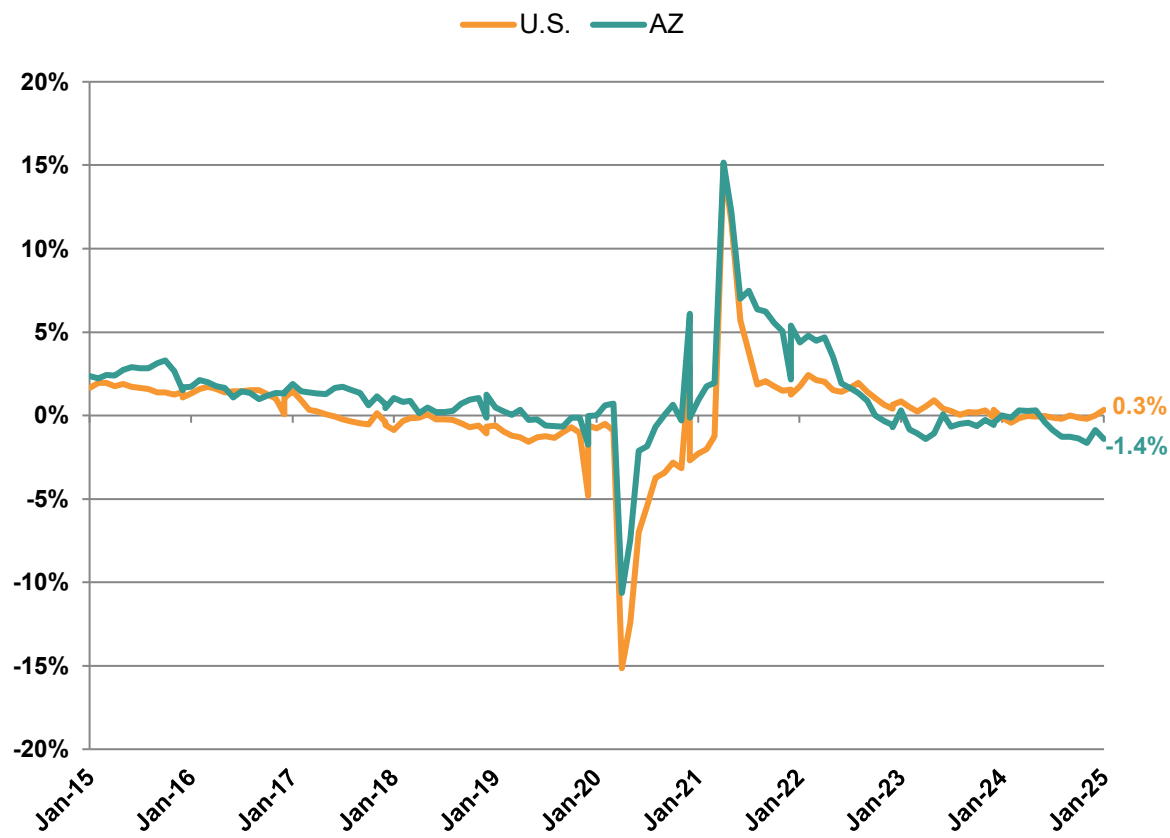
Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change



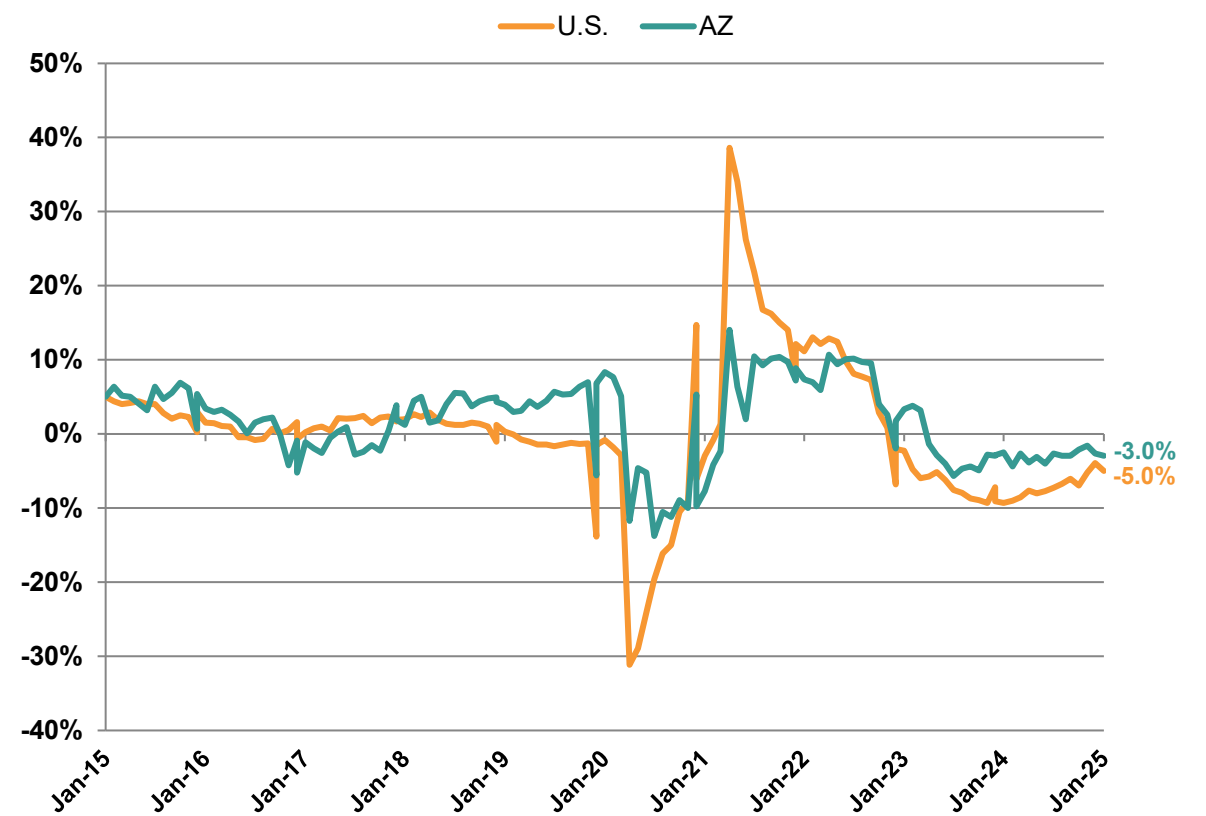

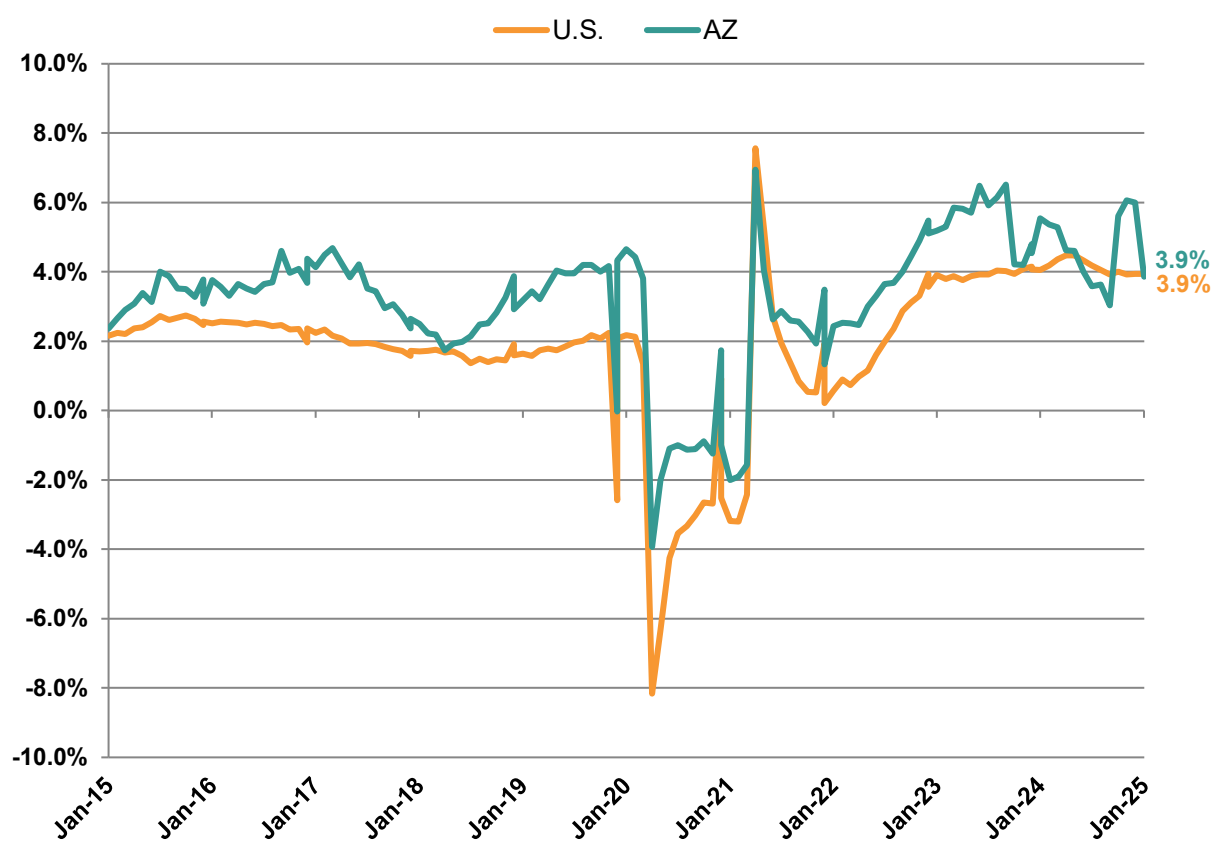
Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change



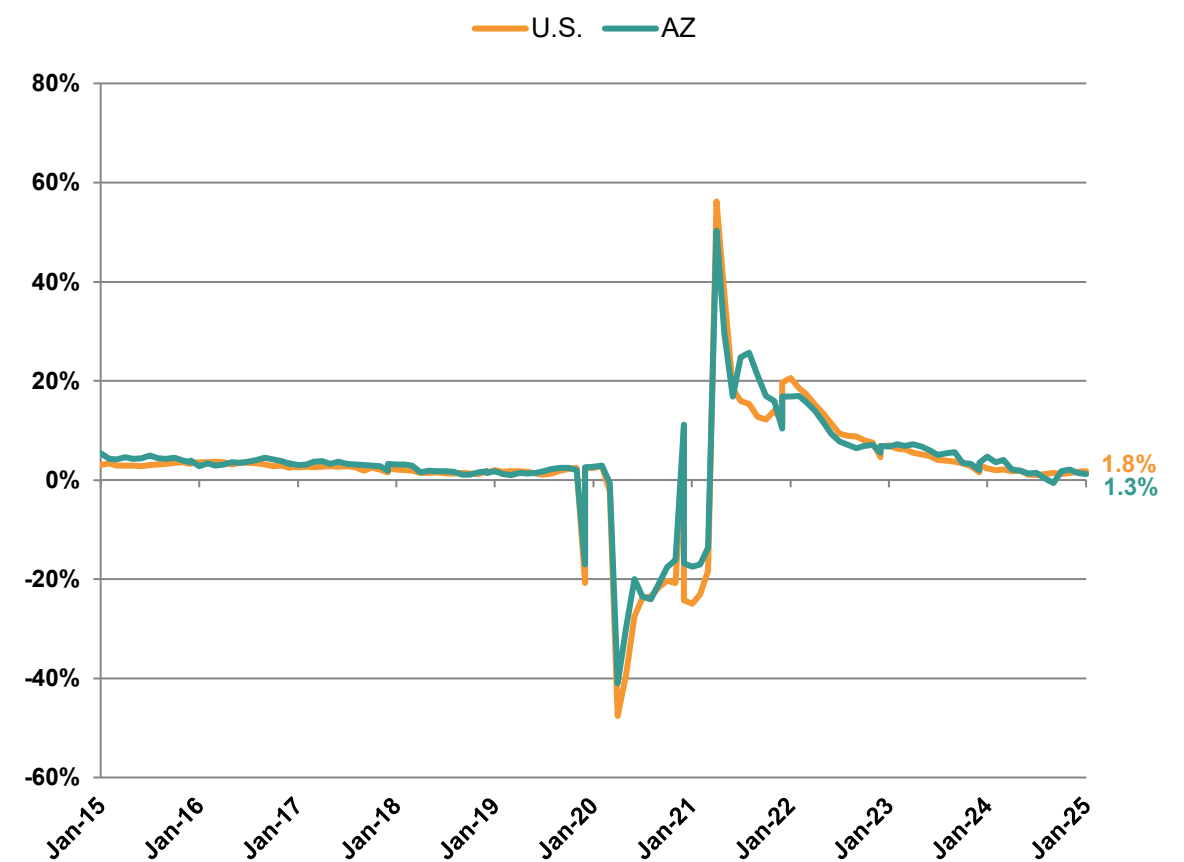
Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
