Arizona Employment Increased by 18,300 Jobs Since May 2024 Arizona Unemployment Remained at 4.1%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate remained at 4.1% in May 2025 from April 2025. The U.S. SA unemployment rate remained at 4.2% in May 2025 from April 2025.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 1,118 individuals, or 0.0%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 48,868 individuals, or 1.3%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 19,300 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 18,300 jobs, or 0.6%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment decreased by -3,500 individuals, or -0.1%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 19,300 jobs in May. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 6,700 jobs on average in May. The private sector recorded a loss of 12,100 jobs in May, led by losses in Professional & Business Services (-4,100 jobs) and Private Educational Services (-4,100 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 900 jobs in May. The government sector recorded a loss of 7,200 jobs in May, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 5,700 jobs. Employment losses in the government sector occurred primarily within State Government Education (-5,100 jobs).

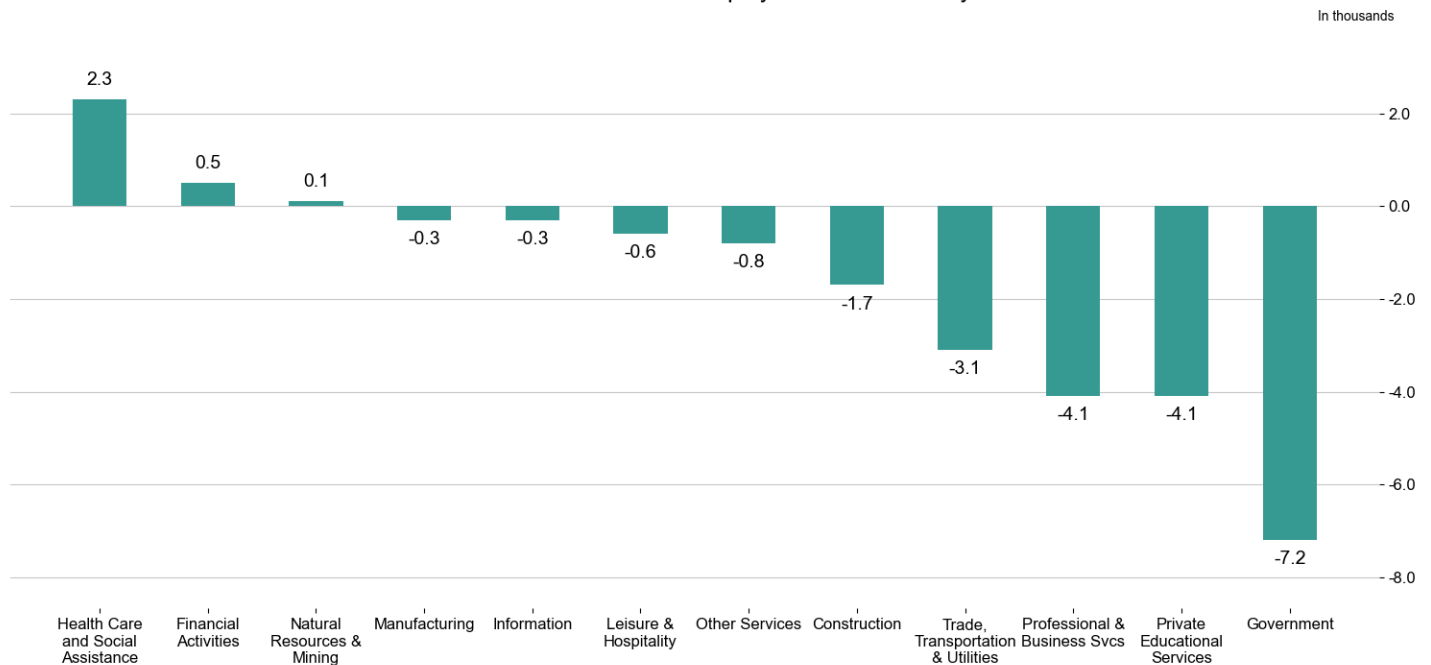

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 18,300 jobs or 0.6% in May year over year. Private sector employment increased by 15,900 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 2,400 jobs year over year.

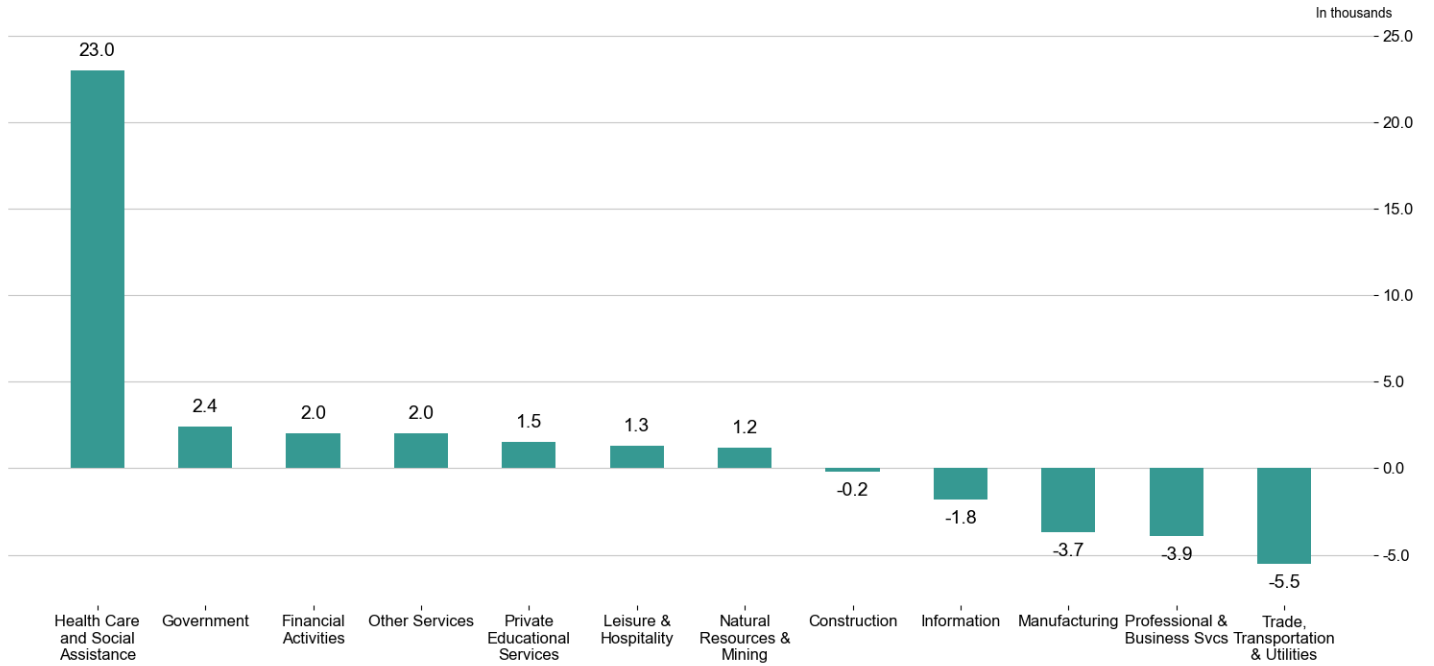

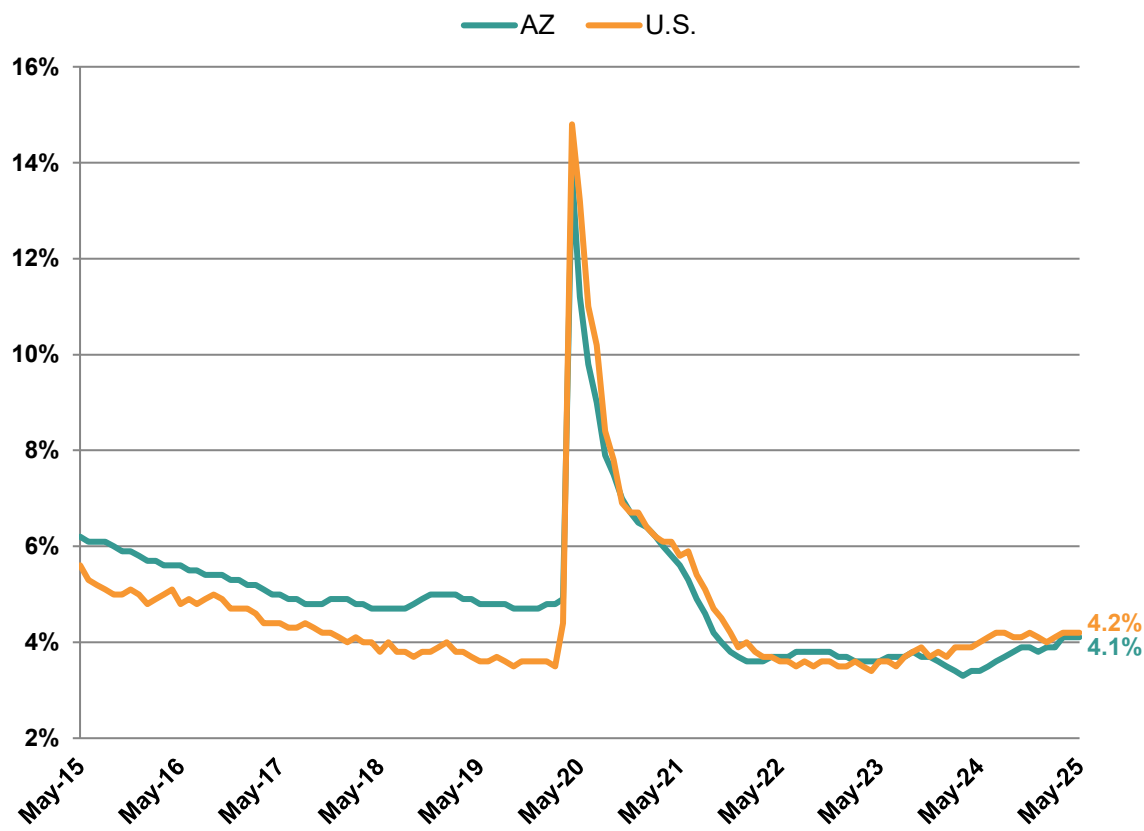
Arizona NSA Year-Over-Year Employment Gain/Loss by Sector



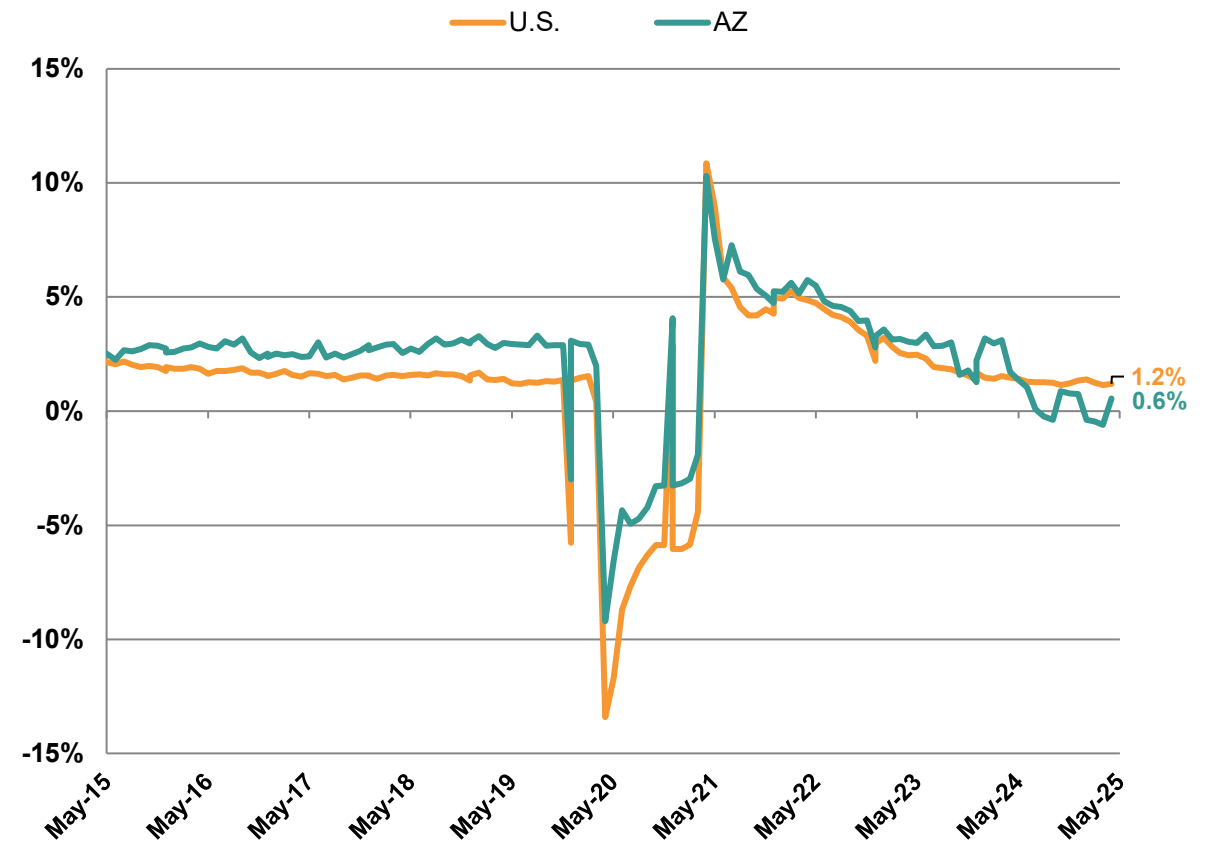

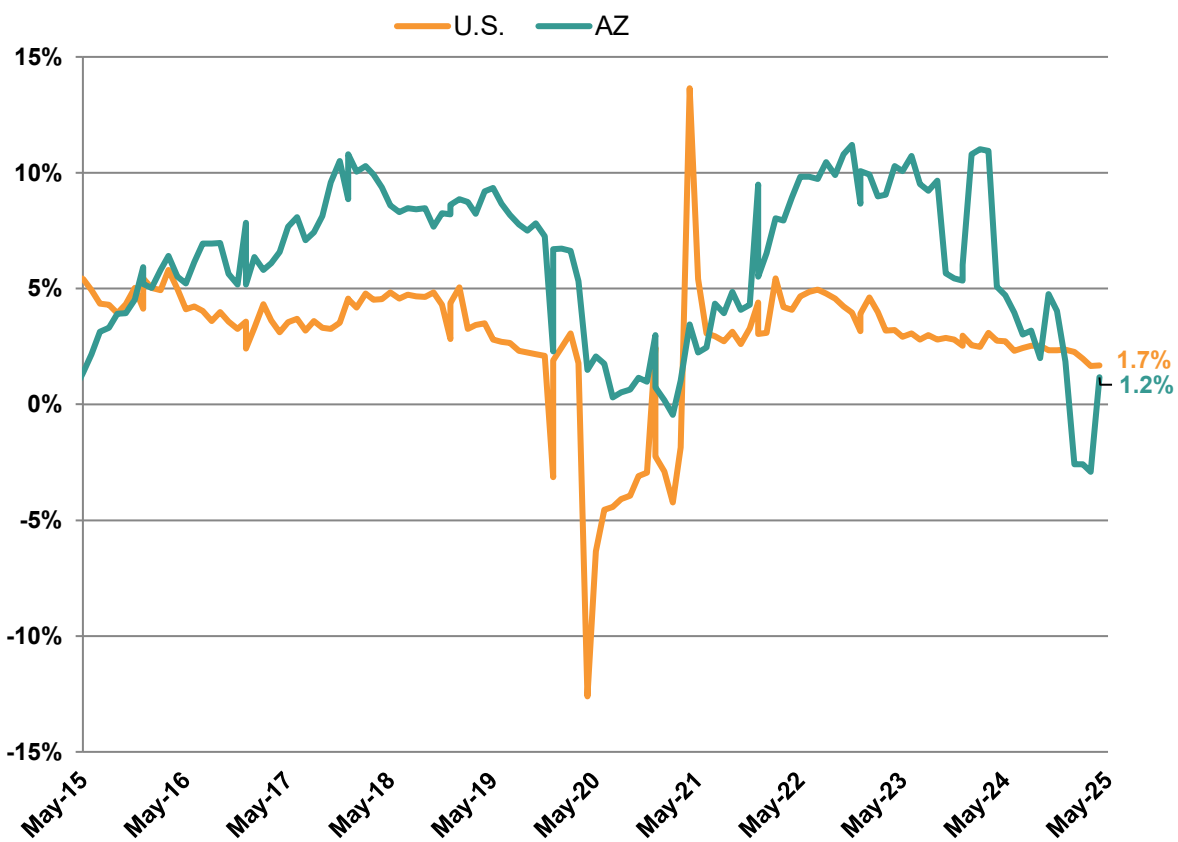
Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted



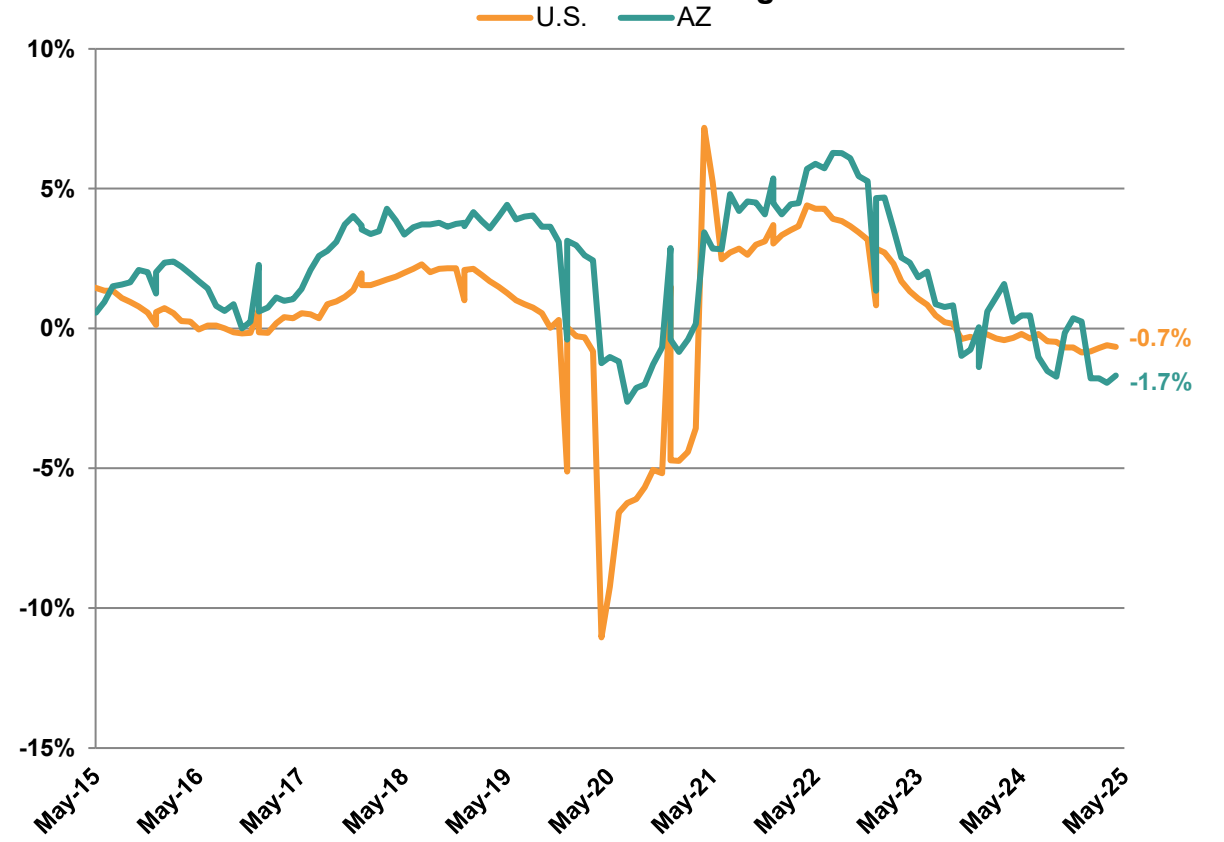
Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change



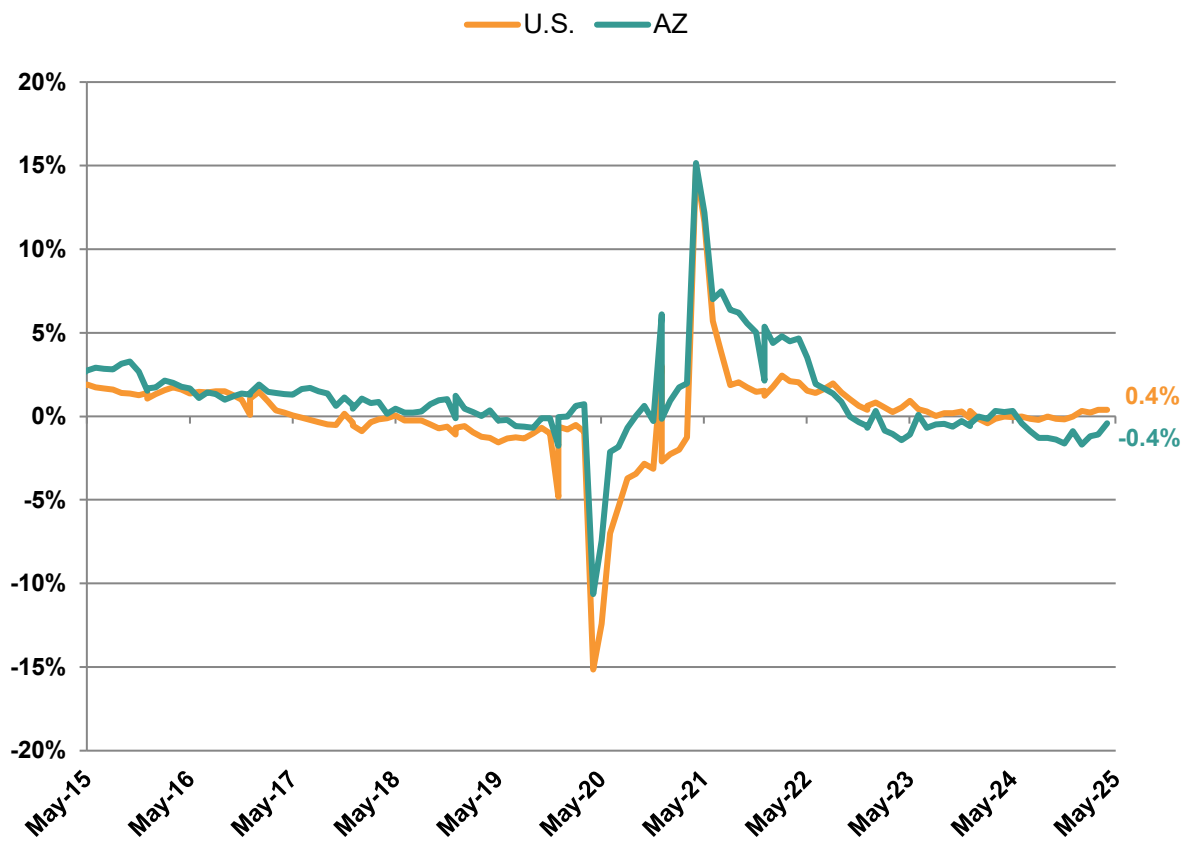
Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change



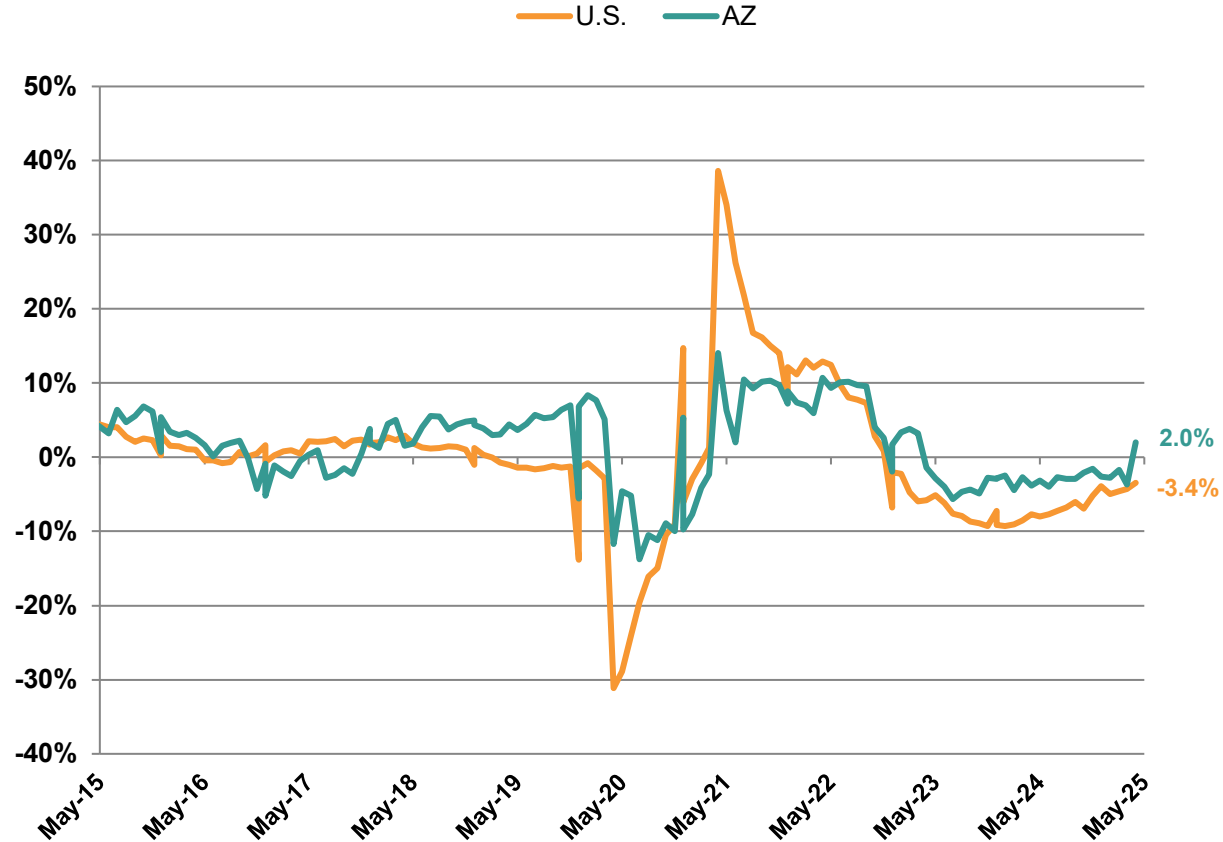

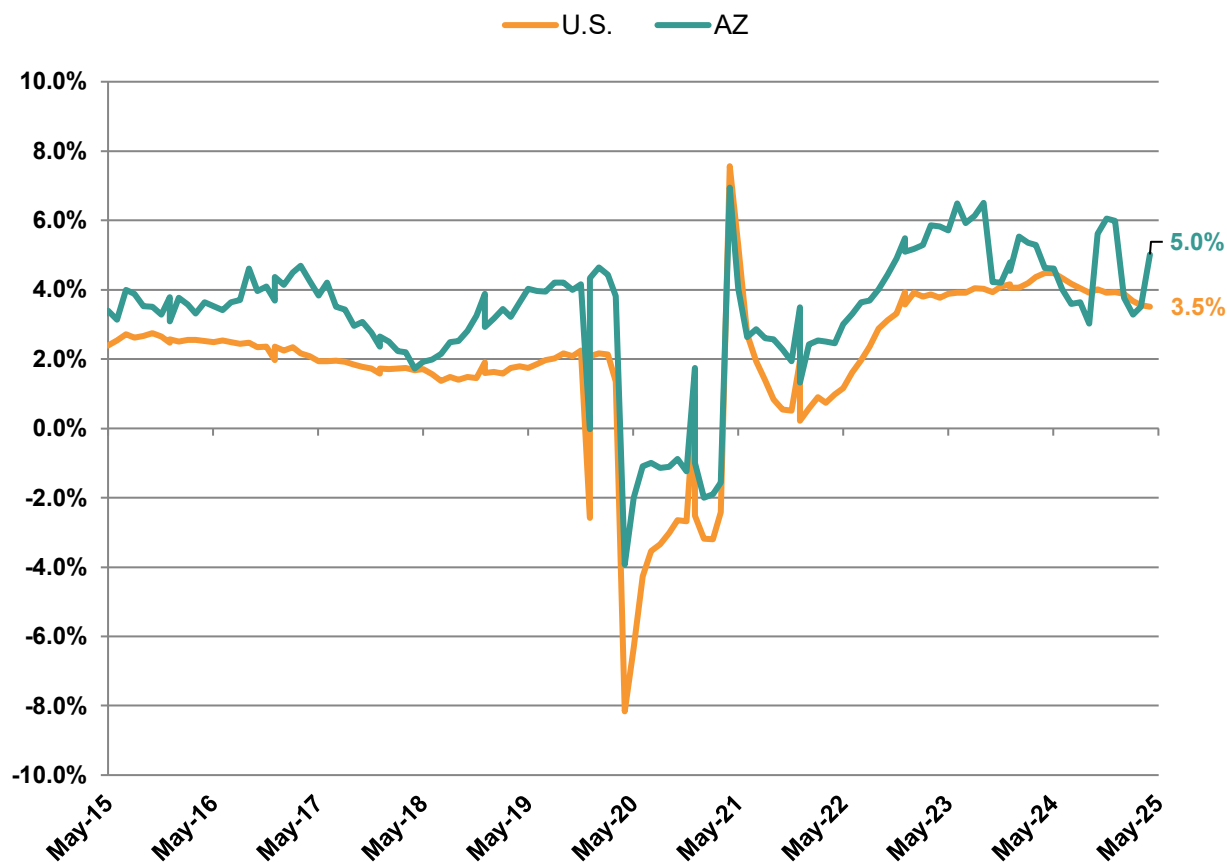
Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change



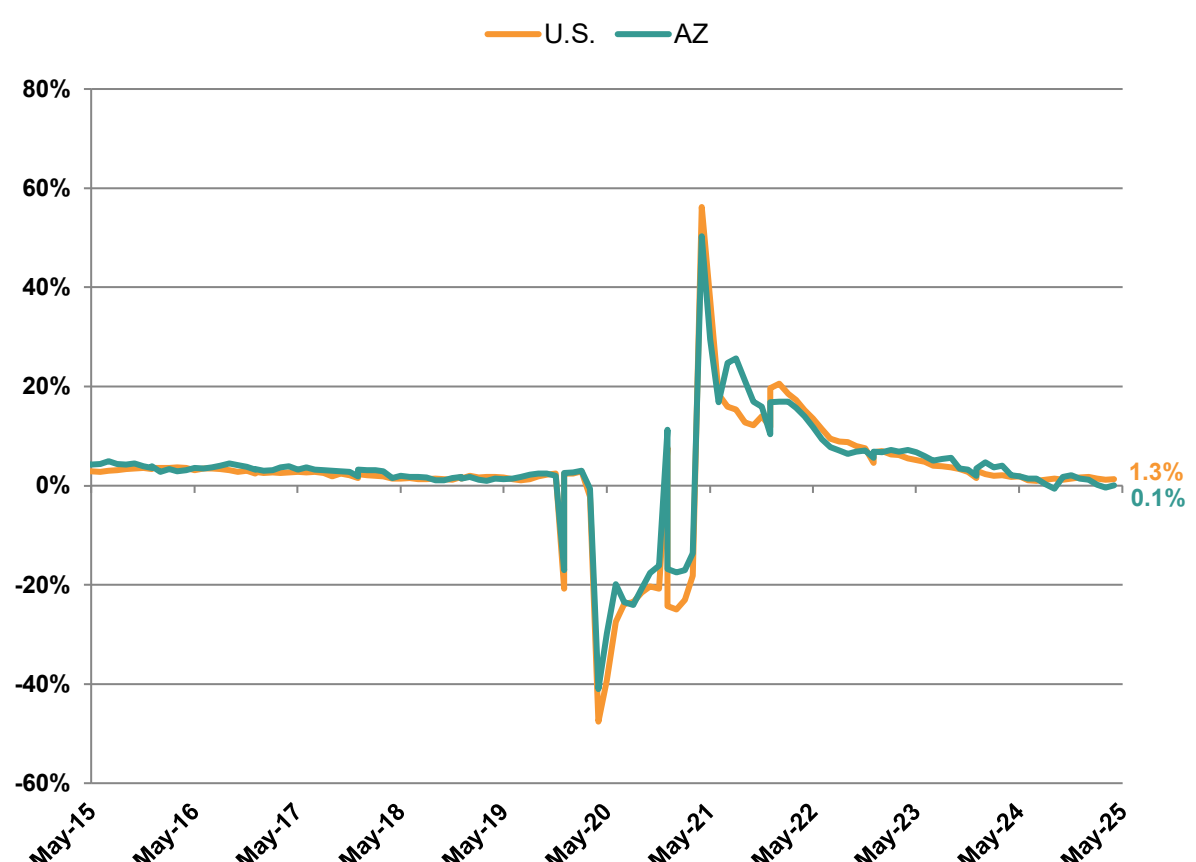
Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
