Arizona Employment Increased by 21,300 Jobs Since November 2024 Arizona Unemployment Increased to 4.3%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 4.3% in November 2025 from 4.2% in September 2025.¹ The U.S. SA unemployment rate increased to 4.6% in November 2025 from 4.4% in September 2025.¹

From September 2025¹ to November 2025, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 27,226 individuals. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 83,081 individuals, or 2.2%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment increased by 17,500 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 21,300 jobs, or 0.6%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment decreased by 4,800 individuals, or -0.1%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 17,500 jobs in November. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment gained 28,800 jobs on average in November. The government sector recorded a gain of 2,400 jobs in November, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average gain of 1,600 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government Education (2,200 jobs). The private sector recorded a gain of 15,100 jobs in November, led by gains in Trade, Transportation & Utilities (10,600 jobs) and Professional & Business Services (1,600 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 27,200 jobs in November.

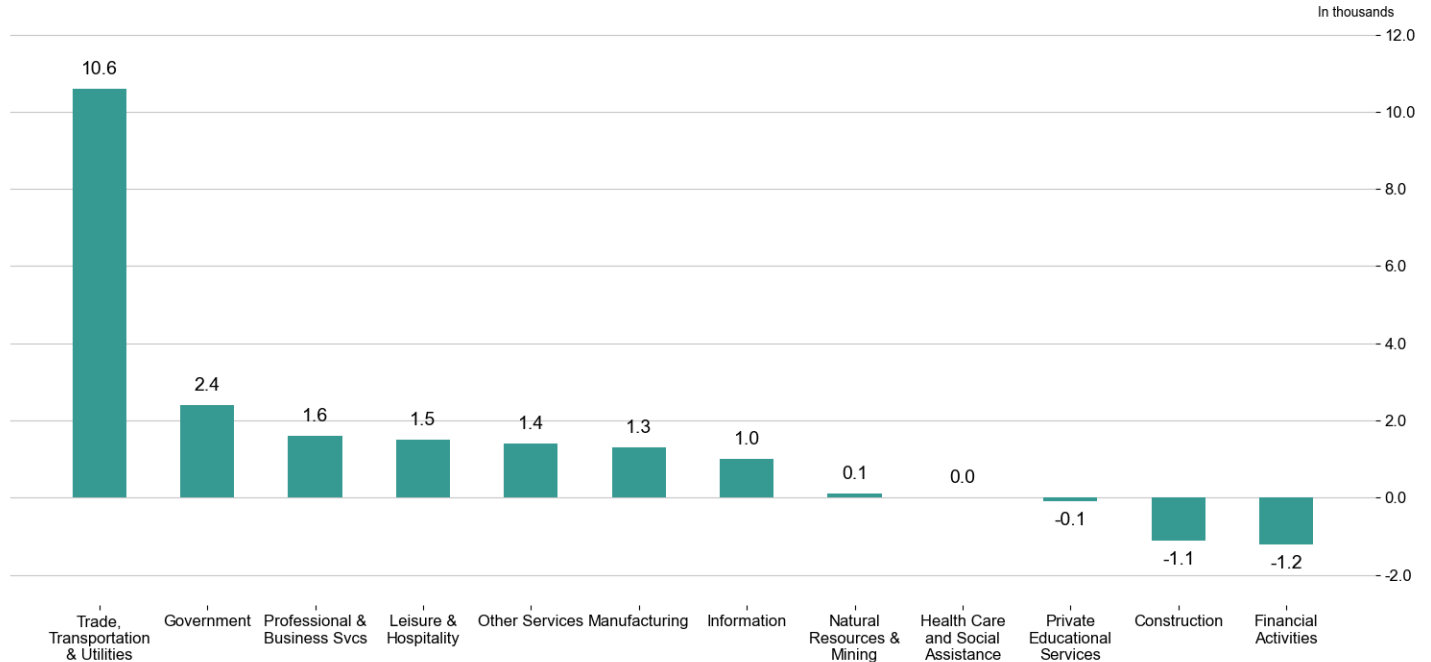

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 21,300 jobs or 0.6% in November year over year. Private sector employment increased by 28,000 jobs year over year, while government employment decreased by 6,700 jobs year over year.

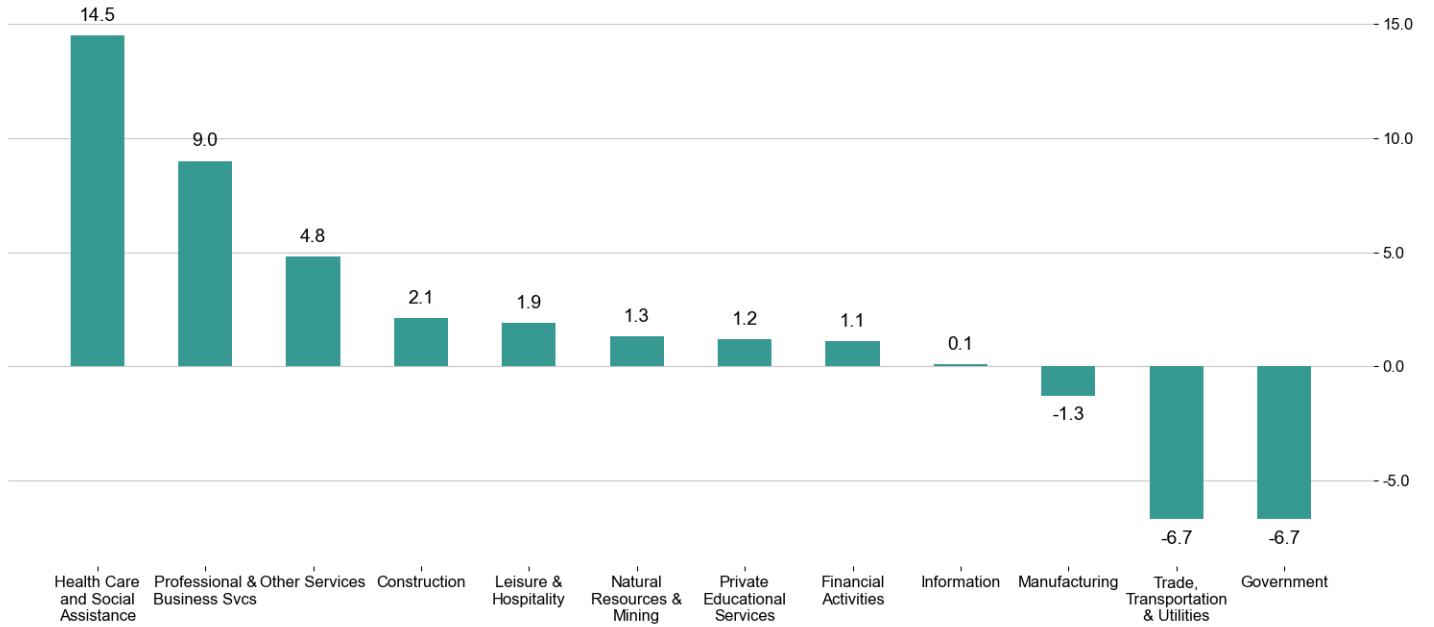

Arizona NSA Year-Over-Year Employment Gain/Loss by Sector

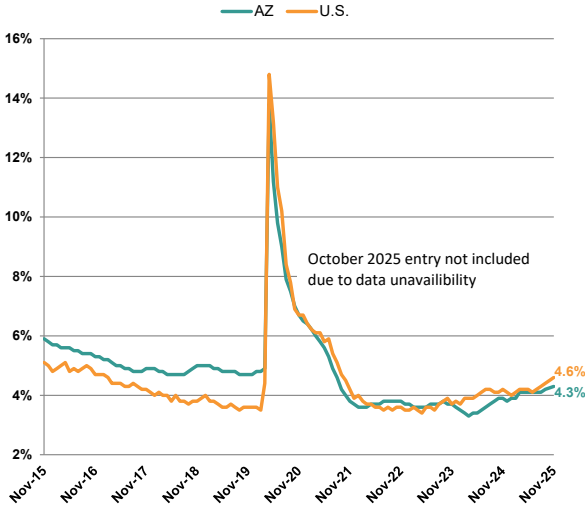

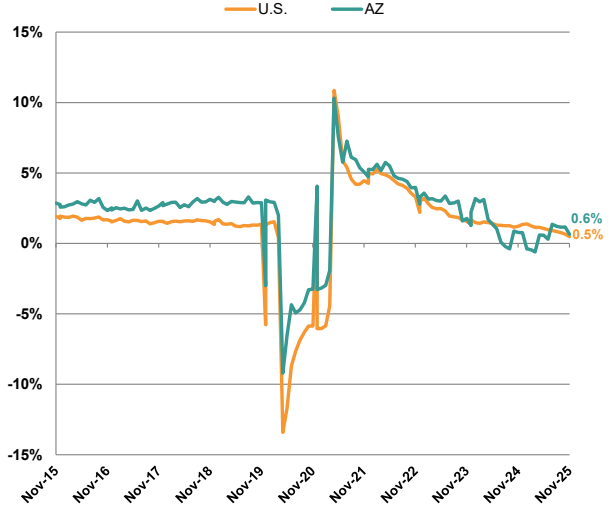

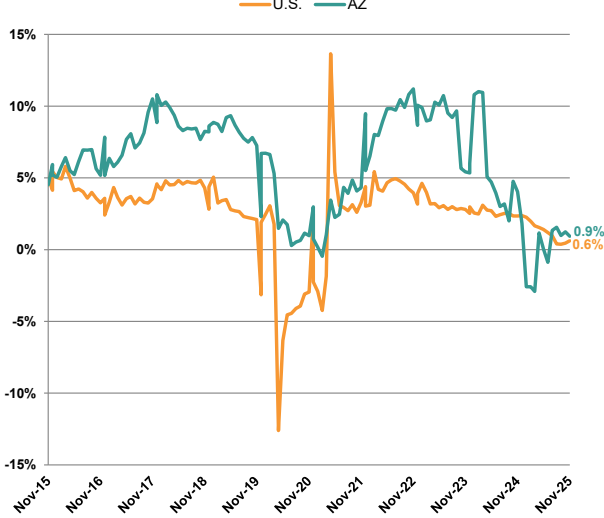
Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted



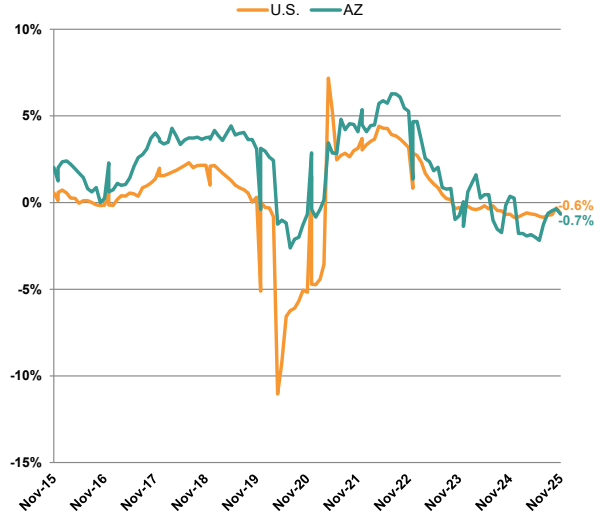
Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change



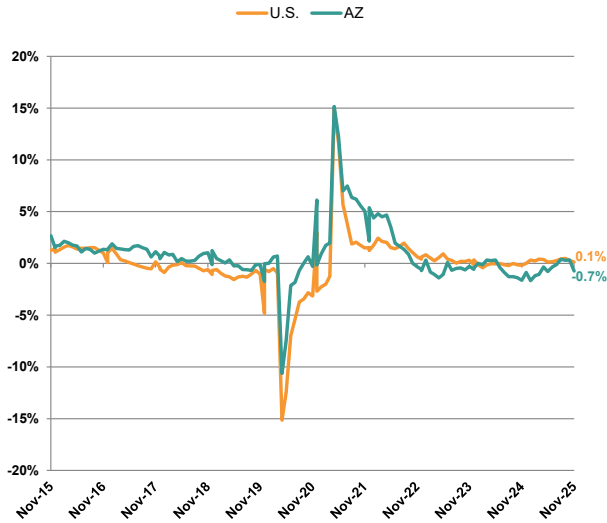
Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change



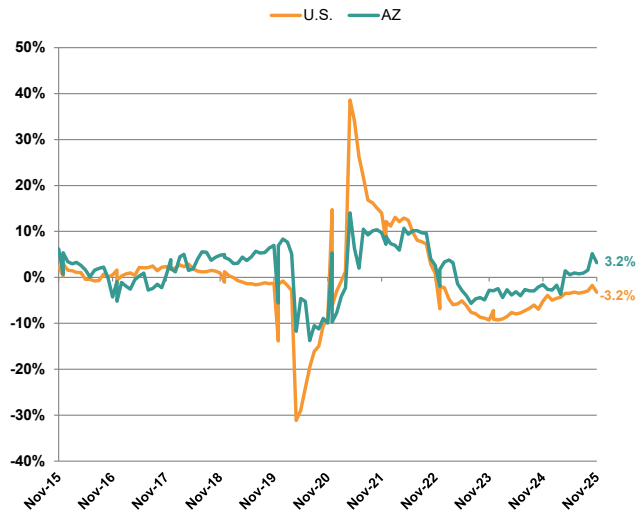

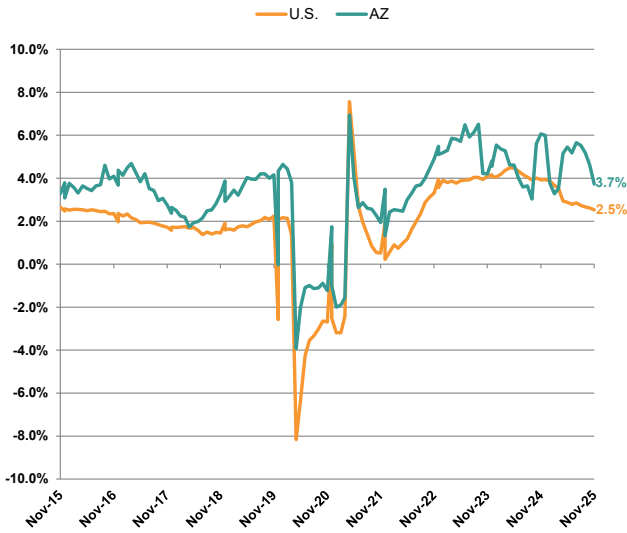
Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change



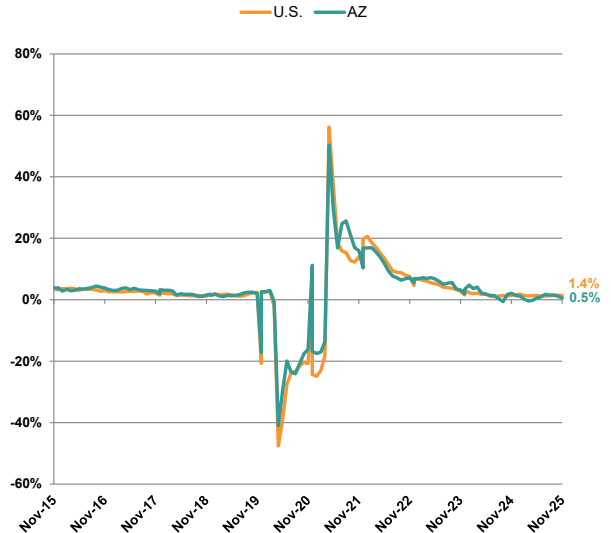
Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
